



Rules and Regulations

These guidelines are for the benefit of all and will help to ensure the health, safety, happiness and proper behavior of all our students. We will be happy to discuss these rules with parents for clarification as needed. We expect the full cooperation of parents and students in complying with the dress code and the school rules.

It is impossible for us to list every single acceptable or unacceptable item, but we hope that it is quite clear what the school expects, should you have any questions please raise them with a member of the administration for clarification.

The following rules and regulations will be enforced by the administration and staff of JETS with no exceptions.

Yeshiva policies:

Leaving Yeshiva for Family Simchas - students are permitted to go home to celebrate the Simchas of immediate family. Please note that each day a student is absent from the yeshiva reduces the effectiveness of the student, by altering his routine and causing him to fall behind in his studies. Please do not make any arrangements without consulting with the Hanholah.

Leaving the yeshiva premises - Since the yeshiva is responsible for the safety of our students we must know where they are at all times. Therefore students may not leave the yeshiva premises without obtaining permission from the Hanholah and signing out. Failure to adhere to this policy will result in severe consequences such as suspension or dismissal from the yeshiva.

Dress Code:

We expect all our students to dress as Yeshiva Bachurim. The external clothing we wear affects our general attitude towards learning and study. If one dresses as a Yeshiva Bachur, one tends to view oneself as a Yeshiva Bachur. We encourage all parents to review the dress code and make their clothing purchases accordingly.

During Davening hats and jackets must be worn. No caps are to be worn in the place of hats during Davening.

Students must wear their *Yarmulke* and *Tzitzis* at all times

Non-acceptable attire

Jeans, baggy pants, shorts
Loud-colored clothing,
Open toe or heel shoes
Vulgar messages on shirts or other clothing

Acceptable weekday attire

Button- down dress shirts
Plain dark pants

Dark-colored shoes or sneakers

Shabbos attire

White shirts
Dark Suit
Polished dress shoes
(These clothes fulfil the Mitzvah of Kavod Shabbos).

Dormitory Rules:

Each student must respect the privacy of other students; the dorm is a place where students can rest without being bothered by other students.

- ◆ Each student is responsible for keeping his room clean at all times
- ◆ Students must dress and undress in a modest way
- ◆ Smoking is prohibited on or off campus for all students
- ◆ Alcoholic beverages are not allowed
- ◆ The office must be notified of any and all medications a student needs
- ◆ Medication of any kind must be brought to the office for safekeeping and dispensing
- ◆ No medicine of any sort is allowed in the dorm rooms
- ◆ Radios and non-Jewish music are not allowed
- ◆ Bicycle riding is allowed only with a helmet (must be provided by parents)
- ◆ Students must receive permission from the faculty before leaving campus (minimum 2 students)

The School (Staff) will assign the rooms; room changes may take place throughout the year. Students are to live in their assigned rooms unless informed otherwise.

Students Behavior:

- ◆ Students must come to class prepared with: paper, pens, notebooks and worksheets
- ◆ Should a student not feel well (cold, allergies, etc.), he must first receive permission from one of the Hanholah members before missing class or Davening
- ◆ Long hair is unacceptable. Neat and short haircuts are required. Students may be asked to alter their hairstyle if the faculty requests it. Students will not be allowed to alter hair color
- ◆ **Foul language will not be tolerated; euphemisms for vulgarity are equally unacceptable**
- ◆ Physical fighting will not be tolerated, nor will any inappropriate physical behavior
- ◆ Verbal abuse of fellow students or staff will not be tolerated
- ◆ All students will have their time to lead the Davening; this is mandatory
- ◆ Food, gum, drinks etc. are not permitted in the classrooms

Not acceptable for use/wear outside of the dorms:

Slippers (includes crocs, flip-flops, sandals etc...)
Phone, MP3 player or any other electronic device

Students are not to bring the following items to school:

- Radios (no exceptions)
- DVD players
- Laptops
- ipod video
- Any electronic video-playing device
- Weapons (including pocketknives)

Should a staff member request that a student hand over an item to be confiscated, there will be no debate. Items can be confiscated for certain lengths of time or permanently.

Additionally, please note that any non-Jewish, inappropriate reading materials or music (as decided by the school administration) are not to be brought to school or it will be confiscated. If you are unsure what is included please contact us at 818-831-3000.

Cell Phones:

The yeshiva will permit cellular phones with the following rules:
Cell phones are allowed to be used during break times only and must be switched off during class hours.
Cell phones may not be Web enabled. There will be no communicating with females except immediate family members. Should a student breach these rules their phone will be confiscated.

Yeshivas Computers:

The yeshiva has computers available for students' educational and recreational use.

This privilege excludes the following usage:

- ◆ Social networking websites (ie. facebook, myspace, etc.)
- ◆ Instant messaging/chatroom
- ◆ File sharing sites
- ◆ Inappropriate websites
- ◆ Downloading or installing anything without prior permission from the administrator

Any student found using the yeshivas computers for these purposes will have their privileges curtailed.

Students with satisfactory behavior will be awarded some or all of the following privileges:

- ◆ Usage of the recreation/game room
- ◆ Usage of the computer room
- ◆ Usage of school bikes (school does not provide helmets)
- ◆ Transportation for shopping
- ◆ Weekly and monthly excursions
- ◆ Usage of weight and fitness center

Students arriving with any prohibited items listed above, including inappropriate attire will have the item confiscated by the school administration until the end of the school year. Additionally, the school may perform random checks to assure the rules are being observed.

We wish to educate and nurture our Talmidim through Ahava and not constant confrontation. It would be unfortunate to send home a student during the year. Please take these rules seriously; it can prevent future Agmas Nefesh.
